*Holiday open show is a qualifier for the 2012 Schooling Show Championships.

Divisions:

- Adult Amateur (AA): A rider age 21* and over who does not receive remuneration for instructing or coaching riders, or training or riding horses.
- Junior- Under 13*: A rider under age 13.
- Junior – 13 and over*: A rider between the ages of 13 and 20.
- Open: Any rider who does not fall in the Adult Amateur or Junior divisions.

*Junior riders who turn 13 or 21 during the qualifying year may compete in the division they were eligible for at the beginning of the qualifying year.

Tests: The 2011 Dressage tests can be found at www.usdf.org and www.usef.org. The Prix Caprilli tests are located on the bottom of the Horse Shows page at www.alamodressage.org/ USEA test can be found at www.useventing.com/.

Location: San Antonio Rose Palace, 25665 Boerne Stage Rd. San Antonio, Texas

Arenas: Competition-covered, sand footing with enclosed fencing. Warm-up –Adjacent covered arena with sand footing.

Lunging: A designated lunging area is available on a first-come first-served basis.

Stabling: 12X12 stalls with solid wood sides are available and includes 2 bags of shavings. Saturday arrival permitted.

Awards: Trophies/Medals for Championship winners (1st thru 3rd place). Ribbons 1st through 6th place

Show Time: Show office will open 1 hour before the show start time.

Entries: Entries must be mailed to Secretary, postmarked by December 1, 2011. Checks payable to "ADA". Current (within 12 months) negative COGGINS is required for every entry.

*If you have not submitted your qualifying scores and fee. You MUST submit copy of test sheets of the two qualifying scores with fee to enter Championship classes.

Ride times: Ride times will be e-mailed before 5:00pm Friday before the show.

Concessions: Concession stand will be open. Exhibitors are welcome to bring their own coolers however alcoholic beverages are NOT permitted.

Dogs: Dogs are welcome but must be on a leash. Facility will fine owners of unleashed dogs.

Refunds: Refunds after closing date (except class fees) are possible in the event of a death in the family or if rider provides a doctor's or veterinarian certificate indicating they or their mount cannot compete. Class fees can also be refunded in these situations only if the show is over subscribed.

Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes, change officials, or refuse entries. Informal attire, boots or half-chaps and **ASTM approved helmets are mandatory** for all riders. USEF/USDF rules will be followed with regards to tack and helmets.
