Unapproved Board of Directors (BoD) Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: May 11, 2011

(As of May 15, 2011)

I. Call to Order

Vice President Carolyn Vandenberg called the meeting to order at In the Irons at 6:38 p.m.

II. Board of Directors Roll Call

Board of Directors present was the following: Carolyn Vandenberg (Vice President/Education Chair), Bill Eash (Treasurer), Cheryl Harlin (Secretary/Sponsorship), and Jennifer Delmer (Member-at-Large), Jill Ammann (Jr/YR Chair), and Leigh Olejer (Schooling Show Chair). Membership/public attendee was Cecilia Cox.

III. Approval of Today's Agenda

Jennifer moved to approve the agenda as presented; Bill seconded. The motion was approved.

IV. Approval of Previous Board of Directors (BoD) Meeting Minutes

Cheryl moved to approve ADA's April BoD/strategic planning meeting minutes; Carolyn seconded. The motion was approved.

V. President's Report

On behalf of President Arlene Gaitan, Carolyn led the meeting with the president's report (see items noted with asterisk).

VI. Vice President's Report

VII. Treasurer's Report

Bill went over the ADA's Profit and Loss by Class and Balance Sheet indicating the Frost Bank checking account balance with a total of \$28,565.87, and the youth account of \$995.45. This reflected ADA's total current assets of \$29,561.32. From the April recognized show, ADA made a profit of \$11,035.90. Bill reported \$471 raised from the silent auction at ADA's April recognized show. The board thanked those who brought the auction items. Jill moved to accept the treasurer's financial reports; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

VIII. Secretary's Report

IX. Member-at-Large Chair's Report

Jennifer has been receiving riding instructor listings/advertisements and updating ADA's website. She also suggested ADA should purchase three mounting blocks for ADA shows.

X. Newsletter Editor's Report

Stephanie Foster will continue to do the ADA newsletter (The Stall Street Journal); ADA will need a local editor to handle content. Arlene will continue to process content/information until the position is filled. For the local editor position, the board recommended having the editor job description detailed in an announcement. Also, the SSJ will be published directly to the ADA website with a Constant Contact an-

nouncement going out to all members. Next, the board suggested placing feature articles in the newsletter and put in place monthly assignments: breed profile by Harlin family in May; poem from Delmer family in June; technical delegate/USEF rules or Southwest Dressage Championship (SWDC) by Carolyn Vandenberg in July; youth nationals by Jennifer Delmer in August; and Arabian dressage horse by Jill Ammann in Feb or sooner.

XI. Junior/Young Riders Chair's Report

Jill reported the past month's activities of ADA Junior/Young Riders. The Judy Campbell-Urban clinic was a successful event for junior/young riders. In addition to the insightful instruction she provided, Judy gave each rider a t-shirt with a catchy motto and a Campbell-Urban bag. A profit of \$120 was achieved from the event. Next, members of the ADA Junior/Young Riders club voted to have an August schooling show at the well attended meeting held on May 9. Jill again generously donated the In the Irons for the venue and will finalize the judge selection. She asked our treasurer to verify insurance coverage for the event. Available club members were given assignments to help run the schooling show. Box lunches will be a fund raising project. Also, ADA Jr /YR members proposed volunteering at Brighter Days and/or Ft Sam Houston's horse facility for community service project.

XII. Education Chair's Report

Carolyn reported contacting a speaker for trailering/hauling briefing with time and location to be determined. She also looked into CPR instruction/certification. She suggested inviting a guest speaker Sandy Venneman, PhD for a two-part lecture "Why Does My Horse Do That?"/ Learning theory and Mind Games/Sport Psychology for the Equestrian and mounted lessons/clinic in fall season. She will check into funding through the Dressage Foundation. The chair also proposed Ride-a-Test event and a Campbell-Urban clinic. Carolyn reported ADA's Cash-Back-for-Education is operating smoothly with numerous applications submitted.

XIII. Committee Reports

Recognized/Rated Horse Shows: Bill reported the ADA's April 2-3 show was a tremendous hit with the increase (from last year) of horses entered and approximately 400 class rides. He thanked everyone who competed and help run the show. Also, the board thanked Molly Porter Burke for donating the QH high point award. For the show program, the board recommended continuing with the riding day sheet noting that it is subject to changes/times are tentative. Stefanie Foster will construct the September horse show program.*

Membership: No report

Website: For the ADA Cash-Back-for-Education program, the point of contact will be changed from Liz Moser to Carolyn Vandenberg on the website form.

Banquet: Per Doug Christensen, Bill reported the availabilities Biga on the Bank and Auden's Kitchen for the annual ADA Awards Banquet; the board selected Biga for January 21, 2012; this will be updated on the website.

Awards: Susan has formed a committee to review the current awards program/form and will report to the board of results/changes which will be posted in ADA's website.

Schooling Show*: Leigh Olejer will be show manager and secretary at ADA's June 26 schooling show and reported having volunteers scheduled to assist. Pat Moj dara "L" will be the judge. Also, the board is tentatively looking at December 11 and the San Antonio Rose Palace as a possible date and place of the schooling championship show. Schooling show score requirements were discussed. Bill will contact Susan Hancock on details. For the July schooling show, the board suggested postponing any decision until further information until a show secretary and site were firmly designated.

XV. New Business

ADA Picnic “Family Day at Rio Cibolo Ranch”*: Arlene proposed having the ADA picnic at Rio Cibolo Ranch. Jill moved to budget \$1,500 for the picnic at Rio Cibolo Ranch; Jennifer seconded. The motion was approved. Jennifer moved to schedule the picnic on Aug 14, 2011; Bill seconded. The motion was approved. The cost per person was tabled pending on fee rates for adults, juniors, etc. Jill volunteered to conduct “Play Day” (western obstacle trail and other games) at the horse arena.

Ride for the Cure*: At the ADA strategic meeting, Arlene proposed conducting a fundraiser for breast cancer research. Bill moved to have this fundraiser at the recognized show on Saturday, September 10; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved. The board recommended clarification on guidelines and source of awards/ribbons, scheduling a representative from the research foundation to make award presentations, publicizing the event via local newspapers (San Antonio, Boerne, Horse Gazette, etc.), deadline for entries, and updating show program with advertisement and sponsors/teams/riders, prize list and ADA website. Jill will prepare a press release.

Omnibus advertising*: Bill moved that the ADA continue to advertise in the USDF Region 9 Omnibus. Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

Budget for USDF Region 9 Business Meeting in August*: Jill moved to approve \$1000 for ADA board attendees’ travel and room expenses; Jennifer seconded. The motion was approved.

ADA storage: Bill will price trailers to accommodate ADA’s equipment/material storage.

Location: Ft Sam Equestrian Center, driveway off Binz-Engleman Rd, behind Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC), right after the RR tracks.

Arenas: Competition-Uncovered, sand footing with enclosed fencing. Warm-up – Adjacent covered arena with sand footing or adjacent outdoor arena with sand footing.

Lunging: A lunging arena is available on a first-come first-served basis. No lunging is allowed in the warm-up arenas.

Stabling: 12X12 stalls with solid wood sides in a new barn are available for \$35 per stall. No shavings are provided but water and electricity are present.

Awards: Ribbons 1st through 6th place

Show Time: Show office will open 1 hour before the show start time.

Entries: Entries are to be mailed to the Show Secretary and must be postmarked by Tue June 14 or in my hand by June 21. Make the check out to Alamo Dressage Assoc. Late entries will be accepted as space is available and with a \$5.00 late fee. A current (with 12 months) negative COGGINS is required for every entry.
