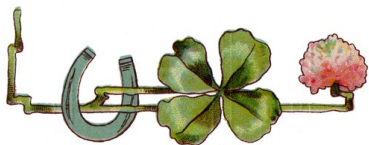

Board of Directors (BoD) Approved Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: February 9, 2011 (As of March 10, 2011)

I. Call to Order

President Arlene Gaitan called the meeting to order at In the Irons at 6:47 p.m.

II. Board of Directors Roll Call

Board of Directors: Arlene Gaitan (President), Cheryl Harlin (Secretary), Jennifer Delmer (Member-at-Large), and Carolyn Vandenberg (Education Chair). Membership attendees: None.

III. Approval of Today's Agenda

Jennifer moved to approve the agenda as present; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

IV. Approval of Previous Board of Directors (BoD) Meeting Minutes

Jennifer moved to approve the January 12, 2011 ADA BoD meeting minutes; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

V. President's Report

In exchange for the use of Laurie Virkstis pictures on the ADA's Shutterfly website pages, Laurie suggested to Arlene two gold level sponsorships and being a vendor at both recognized shows. Cheryl moved to give Laurie two gold level sponsorships and take pictures at both 2011 ADA recognized shows; Carolyn seconded. The motion was approved.

Arlene mentioned a donation was in place for the ADA's education fund and members must contact Bill Eash for any questions/concerns/inputs regarding the account.

Last year, the association earned \$800 for the numerous hours ADA volunteers provided at the Region 9 Championships/Shows. Arlene encouraged members to volunteer for this year's regionals.

For the February Region 9 Business Meeting, Arlene suggested having the association reimburse any board member's travel and lodging expenses. Jennifer moved to have ADA reimburse up to \$200 (\$50 maximum for gas and \$150 maximum for hotel room costs) among board members attending the February 19, 2011 Region 9 meeting in Austin; Carolyn seconded. The motion was approved.

For the next recognized ADA show, Jennifer proposed the ADA Jr/Young Riders' participation in the silent auction. She also suggested allowing the Jr/Young Riders have a section/page in the ADA Stall Street Journal through coordination with Vicki Krebsbach.

XII. Education Chair's Report

Carolyn distributed hardcopies of 2011-2012 educational programs ideas (equine nutrition, veterinarian/farrier issues, barn safety, rider physical exercises, competition, etc.) and welcomed any inputs from the board and membership. For the March 5 scribe clinic, Arlene will help firm the time and place.

Recognized/Rated Horse Shows: Jennifer is currently working on obtaining AQHA approval at the ADA recognized shows. She covered the application fees (\$50/show) and proposed QH high point award; Arlene suggested creating a press release for the QH audience. Carolyn will donate two gift baskets for each recognized show day for ticket drawings in April.

Banquet: The banquet was a total success. The silent auction grossed over \$1,000; \$330 was raised by the ADA Jr/YR auction items. The board thanks the auction donors and banquet organizer Doug Christianson and his helpers.

Meeting Date: March 9, 2011

(As of March 15, 2011)

I. Call to Order

President Arlene Gaitan called the meeting to order at In the Irons at 6:41 p.m.

II. Board of Directors Roll Call

Board of Directors present was the following: Arlene Gaitan (President), Carolyn Vandenberg (Vice President/Education Chair), Bill Eash (Treasurer), Cheryl Harlin (Secretary), and Jennifer Delmer (Member-at-Large). Jill Ammann (Jr/YR Chair) is on maternity leave. Membership/public attendees were Cecilia Cox, Karen Peacock and Amy Allen.

III. Approval of Today's Agenda

Jennifer moved to approve the agenda as presented; Bill seconded. The motion was approved.

IV. Approval of Previous Board of Directors (BoD) Meeting Minutes

Bill moved to amend the previous board meeting minutes from "...Jennifer proposed the ADA Jr/Young Riders to hold a separate silent auction" to "...Jennifer proposed the ADA Jr/Young Riders' participation in the silent auction"; Carolyn seconded. The motion was approved.

V. President's Report

Within USDF Region 9 activities, Kathy Jones, Region 9's Regional Championship Chair, is recruiting volunteers for the April 29 to May 1 CDI at Katy TX. In exchange for their time, volunteer will be given hotel rooms (2 -3 in a room) and fed on the show grounds. There is a plan to have a silent auction and 1/2 of the proceeds have already been committed to the Region. Kathy is proposing that the other 50% go to the GMO's that help with volunteers and sponsorship. Also, the 2011 USDF Region 9 Summer Meeting is scheduled on [Aug 27-28](#) in Galveston, TX.

Vera Muckleroy, the Region 9's Instructors/Trainers Chair, requested permission to use ADA's dressage arena rails and letters for test purposes. Bill moved to loan ADA's dressage equipment to Vera who will pick up and deliver the parts for use of the USDF certification of instructors testing at no cost; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

Arlene will be conducting a USDF Region 9 Adult Amateur survey which will provide valuable information of trends and profiles of participants.

Regarding ADA's April 2-3 show, the deadline for sponsorship is March 18, 2011.

ADA Board Minutes cont.

There was discussion to recognize Jill Ammann for her tremendous generosity of permitting ADA to use In the Irons facility at no charge for the recent schooling show, the scribe workshop, and Richard Howard riding clinic. To show ADA's appreciation of Jill's actions, Carolyn moved to provide her ½ to full page advertisement space for both ADA's rated shows; Cheryl seconded. The motion was approved.

VI. Vice President's Report

VII. Treasurer's Report

Bill moved that ADA purchase insurance from AIG through Donna Myer to be effective on April 1, 2011 for one year; Jennifer seconded. The motion was approved on March 4. As a result, ADA saved approximately \$800 by switching insurance coverage. Bill also mentioned ADA's ATM card was hacked; the card was cancelled and another one was on order. He went over the ADA's Profit and Loss by Class, the Frost Bank checking account with a total of \$13,778.39, and Balance Sheet indicating the checking account balance and the youth account of \$835.75. This reflected ADA's total current assets of \$14,614.14. Carolyn moved to accept the treasurer's financial reports; Jennifer seconded it. The motion was approved.

VIII. Secretary's Report

Cheryl reported past activities. The high point ribbons were fixed and used at the Feb 27 schooling show. Also, the thank you cards to all the donors of the banquet silent auction were mailed. She brought more estimates for ADA note cards; the estimate bids were narrowed down to three. Lastly, the motion on changing insurance coverage was completed on March 4.

IX. Member-at-Large Chair's Report

Jennifer suggested the classified section of ADA's website should be changed to a trainer's page listing riding instructors.

X. Newsletter Editor's Report

Vicki reported that she is working as the SSJ editor on a monthly basis until a replacement is found. Starting with the March issue, the SSJ will be published directly to the ADA website with a Constant Contact announcement going out to all members. Mid-month is desirable for publication so that the deadline for submissions would be at the end of each month.

XI. Junior/Young Riders Chair's Report

Jennifer reported the Richard Howard riding clinic was a success; there was a profit of over \$100 made. ADA Jr/YR members Kassidy Peacock, Madeline Ramon and Rebecca Harlin, were present for volunteer duties. The ADA board thanked Karen Peacock for graciously donating her time, providing lunches, and covering the clinician's travel expense for the Richard Howard Clinic. Kassidy Peacock, the Jr/YR ADA president, will provide an after action report of the clinic.

At the last ADA Jr/YR meeting, members proposed volunteering at Triple H in the summer as a community service project. They also mentioned having a social at one of the member's home. For the April recognized show, some members will decorate full size dressage pads for silent auction fundraising prizes.

XII. Education Chair's Report

Carolyn reported that on March 5, USEF "r" judge Kat Kyle conducted a two-hour scribe clinic/workshop which was attended by 12 participants at In the Irons. Again, Jill Ammann donated the facility and Carolyn and the board thanked her. Karen Peacock also attended and gave her helpful input about scribing from a scorers point-of-view. Kat gave out USDF scribe guidelines and went over important information. Then she judged training, first and second level tests from video while the scribe attendees recorded scores and comments on actual test sheets. Kat reviewed each test and answered questions before moving on to the next test level. About half of the participants were unsure about scribing at the April show; there were several volunteers and a couple of declines. Refreshments were served; the cost of the clinic was lunch for Kat.

Regarding educational programs, Carolyn mentioned having a safety briefings covering highway hauling, EMT operations, CPR instruction/certification and barn/facility management. She proposed organizing an adult camp and inviting a sports psychologist to brief riders/trainers.

XIII. Committee Reports

Recognized/Rated Horse Shows: For the April 2-3 show, the prize list will reflect the new closing date of 19 March rather than 12 March; this change will require notification to USEF and shouldn't impact ADA show secretary operations. ADA's current scribe chair, Heidi Abshire needs more scribes for the upcoming show. ADA will need a new scribe chair after the April show. Stabling will be handled by Hillary Harper. The board thanked Jennifer for successfully obtaining AQHA approval at April show which will be added to the prize list. Jennifer's mother Molly Porter Burke (sp?—see Jen's email) will donate QH high point award for either Junior/Young Rider or Adult Amateur; competitors will be reminded of this high point award when they obtain their class ride times. Bill moved to have ADA cover the \$50 AQHA approval application fee and Carolyn seconded; the motion was approved. ADA will attempt to contact more breed associations for the September show. Finally, a show committee meeting will be schedule with time and place to be determined.

Membership: Linda Pedde reported ADA currently has 95 members.

Website: For the ADA Cash-Back-for-Education program, the point of contact will be changed from Liz Moser to Carolyn Vandenberg on the website.

Banquet: No report

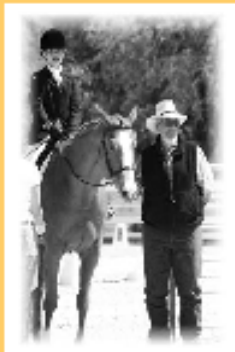

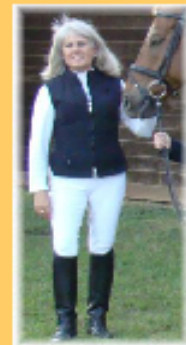
Headgear Reminder

Effective March 1, 2011, for dressage: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test).

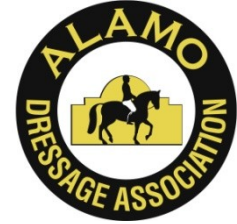
