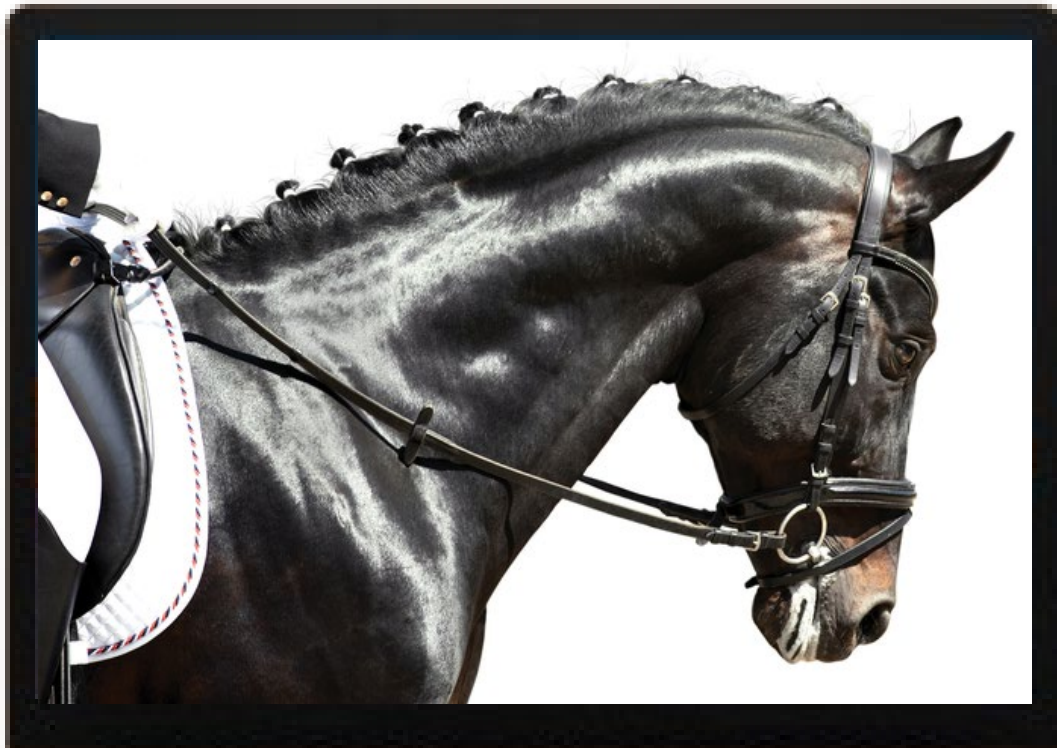

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DIVISIONS:

- **Adult Amateur (AA):** A rider age 21* and over who does not receive remuneration for instructing or coaching riders, or training or riding horses.
- **Junior- Under 13:** A rider under age 13.
- **Junior – 13 and over:** A rider between the ages of 13 and 20.
- **Open:** Any rider who does not fall in the Adult Amateur or Junior divisions.

2. ENTRY PROCEDURES: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

A. **Show Entries:**

1. Online only: www.alamodressage.org. Complete entry and pay on-line.
2. Please include a YouTube link of your ride(s) where requested.
3. Horse/rider are not officially entered until payment & completed entry are received.

B. **How to Video Your Ride: Changes effective 1/1/21**

1. Rides must be videotaped from "C" and in horizontal or landscape mode.
2. Zooming is permitted when the rider is at the far end of the arena, but the judge must be able to see both sides of the arena and letters to judge size/shape of the circles and must be able to see full horse/rider in the corners.
3. Sound must be on.
4. Arena and arena letters must be clearly marked.
5. Standard or small arena is acceptable. Any safe footing is allowed.
6. Tests may be called, but NO coaching allowed during the test.
7. Riders must salute (if required by the test) at the beginning of the test and at the end of the test.
8. **Freestyles:** Music must be clearly heard on the video.
9. **Leadline & Equitation:** Horse and rider combination must show at least 20 meters of each gait required at the level, in each direction, including upward and downward transitions, and a halt facing "C".
10. Videos that are poor quality (shaking, unsteady, not showing full arena, etc...) may result in elimination.
11. Download your video to YouTube and clearly label your video using the following *naming convention*:

First Name + Last Name + Horse Name + Test Level + Test Number

Examples: "Charlotte Dujardin Valegro First Level Test 3"

"Jane Smith Rusty WD Level 1 Test 3"

- C. Show management reserves the right to limit entries, add, combine, or divide classes, add, substitute or change officials, modify or cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management.

- E. Copies of tests will be emailed to riders within 30 days after the end of the show.

4. **LATE ENTRIES:** All entries must be emailed on or before the close date or will be considered a late entry. Each late entry will be charged a **late fee of \$25.00**.

5. **LEADLINE CLASS:** To be ridden at a WALK by a child who has **not** reached his/her **8th birthday as of December 31, 2021**. To be judged on manners and suitability of mount to rider and rider position/effectiveness. Children riding

in this class are not eligible to compete in any other class. No stallions. One handler per entry; handler must be at least 18 years of age. Please list date of birth of competitor on entry form. Feet in stirrups, hands on reins, ASTM/SEI protective headgear, and boots are required. English or Western tack.

6. **EQUITATION CLASSES (includes Western Dressage Equitation):**

- A. Walk Equitation limited to riders who have never competed in Walk Trot Equitation, Intro Level or above, or WD Introductory Level or above.
- B. Walk-Trot Equitation limited to riders who have never competed at Training Level or above or WD Basic Level or above.

7. **TACK & EQUIPMENT:**

8. **ATTIRE & HEADGEAR:** Prefer attire that meets USEF/USDF and WDAA regulations, but coats are optional. Dressage riders should dress with conservative color riding pants and shirts and footwear (dress or field boots, paddock or jodhpur boots - half chaps are allowed) and proper headgear (ASTM approved helmets). Western Dressage riders should follow WDAA regulations with regards to attire and headgear.

9. **RIBBONS, PRIZES, AND AWARDS:** Ribbons are optional but available for an additional fee. See Fee Schedule. Classes will be placed as soon as possible, but within 30 days after the end of the show. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place. Tests will be emailed, and ribbons will be sent via regular mail approximately 30 days after the end of the show.

10. **HIGH POINT CHAMPION AND RESERVE:** Ribbons are optional but available for an additional fee. See Fee Schedule. If you pay a ribbon fee for all of your individual classes your High Point and Reserve ribbons will be mailed at no additional cost. Champion will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the **highest score** at each level. Freestyle scores are excluded. Reserve champion will be awarded to the second highest score. A minimum score of 50% must be achieved and a minimum of 3 riders must be entered in the division for High Point awards to be given.
